Peter "Pete" Jackson

With gratitude for his gentle, humorous kindness, we sadly say goodbye to Peter "Pete" Jackson, who left his wife's arms searching for a new hiking trail on January 29, 2025, after a long, courageous journey with dementia.

Born John Sherman Peters Jackson in St. John, New Brunswick to the late John "Jack" Frederick Lester and Margaret Sherman (Peters) Jackson, Peter will be forever remembered by his beloved best friend and wife, Anne "Annie" Camozzi; sons, Tom and Ian; step-children, Jamie Braid (Sionnach) and Leanna Braid; the "Grandkid Gang"; Sam (Maddie), Lindsay, Olivia, Lyla, Lee, and Chloe; brother, Dr. Robert Jackson (Beverley); cousin, Rod MacLennan (Robin); and former daughters-in-law, Lisa and Cori.

In his long career as a forester at Stora, he was recognized nationally for his innovations to protect waterways with The Tree of Life Award. He loved his Stora buddies, especially "sitting around to tell a few lies." After retirement, Peter designed and built hiking trails so others could share his love of 'forest bathing,' the Japanese concept shinrin yoku he fervently believed in. Although he and Annie hiked all across Canada, Peter believed Antigonish County's forests, farmlands and shorelines had the best soul-soothing vistas. He had a personal mission to connect people with the healing power of these landscapes through his trails. He was honoured with The Summit Award from Hike Nova Scotia.

Creative in so many ways, Peter painted oils, designed and finished the inside of a passive solar house for himself, Annie and "The Gang," complete with peeled spruce trunks. He was an inventor who loved tinkering in his workshop, building many things, especially to improve Annie's life when she became disabled. Peter was a witty storyteller whose shoreline bonfires will be fondly remembered. Though Peter and Annie navigated many "brambles," their devotion and absolute delight in each other never wavered. Deep gratitude to Dr. Jane Anne Howard, long time caregivers Shirley Ross, Eunice Kroeger, Frank DeLorey, and Boyke Turniawan (with Mike). Thank you to all the RK MacDonald Nursing Home staff, Gail George, and the volunteers who brought dogs to visit.

Visitation was held in C.L. Curry Funeral Home, 135 College Street, Antigonish, on Saturday, February 1, 2025, from 2 to 4pm. No service at Peter's request.



PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT Council of the County of Antigonish intends to consider and, if deemed advisable, to:

- Amend the Eastern Antigonish Land Use By-law to rezone a portion of 385 East Tracadie Road, PID 01252956, East Tracadie from Rural (R-1) to Residential Multi-unit (R-2).
- Redesignate the property identified as PID01212117 from Rural Development to Commercial under the West River Antigonish Harbour Municipal Planning Strategy Generalized Future Land Use Map, and to rezone the same property from Local Commercial (C-1) Zone to the General Commercial (C-2) zone on the West River Antigonish Harbour Land Use By-law Zoning Map, and for the addition of small-scale automobile sales as a permitted use in the General Commercial (C-2) Zone in the West River Antigonish Harbour Land Use By-law.

Canadian Navigable Waters Act

Neil Pengelly (Owner) hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Navigable Waters Registry pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act for public comment described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 10(1)(b) of the said Act,

Owner has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<https://common-project-search.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 12174 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

Floating walkway 4.75 ft wide by 265 ft long from lot number 75224071 to lot number 75224089 across Rory's Pond at 4024 St. Peters Fourchu Rd, St. Esprit, NS.

Floating walkway constructed with HDPE plastic cubes, held in place with 3" galvanized steel pipes driven into the ground every 10 metres with a 16 ft long aluminum walkway at each shoreline. A 7 ft long aluminum gangway in the middle can be raised to allow boats to pass through.
